Rough Play and Play Fighting

We are experiencing an increased amount of play fighting in every year group. In Foundation 1 and 2, some of the children are hurting each other as part of a game or in response to playful fighting. Some children are using the term 'bad guy' which is offensive to others. Please could you remind your children not to use that sort of language in their play at school? Some children have said that they are basing their

games around Fortnite! If you look at the image below you can quickly see that it is not suitable for children at Walter as our oldest children are 7!



"What is Fortnite and does the video game have an age rating certificate?

Fortnite's Battle Royale mode, in which 100 online players are put in a battle field to fight until death until one player remains, is the most successful part.

Technically, Fortnite is set in a dystopian world where 98 per cent of Earth's population suddenly disappears, living conditions become difficult, and zombie-like creatures roam the Earth - the player is among the remaining 2 per cent whose job it is to survive.

After the apocalypse, "survivor bases" were set-up and each player is in charge of looking after these bases before trying to find a way to return Earth to normal.

Those form the centrepiece of the story for the co-operative "Save the World" mode, but play not part in the free-to-play Battle Royale mode.

The video game welcomes players aged 12 and above."

Even more shocking is that some of our children have been playing Grand Theft Auto (GTA): "**Grand Theft Auto** is an extremely violent game that earns its **18-rating** in almost every respect. It contains scenes of regular drug use, prostitution, nudity and in one particularly harrowing scene asks the player to torture another human being."

Please do not allow your children to watch or play these games. Thank you.

We have been speaking to the groups of children who are playing roughly and have reminded them that rough play and play fighting is not acceptable at school. We will be monitoring the situation very closely. We have seen children using 'kick boxing', karate style chops! Swinging, punching and even trying to throttle each other. This will not be tolerated, even as part of a game. We will begin to remove playtimes from children who conduct themselves in this way.

We will be creating a notice board to remind everyone how to play at Walter Infant School and Nursery.

Smacking as a sanction

We have had a number of children worried that they will be smacked at home or disclosing that they have been smacked; we do not condone smacking as a sanction or punishment. It can be very difficult for children to discriminate between an adult hitting them and a child hitting another child or in some cases an adult. We have also had children scratching and pinching each other.

Please consider positive behaviour management; rewarding good behaviour using praise and encouragement, sticker or reward charts etc. or a treat such as a bike ride or a visit to the park. I know it is not easy sometimes, but hitting and smacking is never the right solution to a problem.

Black History Month

October is Black History month; our curriculum is very broad and balanced and we already learn about Nelson Mandela and Rosa Parks and we base much of our PSHE on our British Values, particularly Tolerance and Respect. It is important for the children to learn about our differences, to have empathy for others and their way of life and to understand that the world we live in has been influenced by actions and incidents from


