
#### **New Equipment**

I am extremely excited as we have just taken delivery of lots and lots of new toys for outside play for Foundation Stage and Key Stage One; we have used some of the money made at the Christmas Fair and donated by the PTA. #### Attendance

Some families will have received letters about attendance this week; we were visited by our Educational Welfare Officer (EWO) and agreed that we would send attendance letters to the families who have children who have attended school for less than 90% of the school terms. We recognise that some children have been ill, which is very unfortunate. If a child has attendance below 90% they are classified as a persistent absentee and flagged up by the system we use to record attendance. There is a recognised correlation between attendance and attainment; please ensure that you children can come to school everyday as long as they are well enough.



#### Lunar New Year

The children have been learning all about the Lunar (Spring) New Year this week and now know that 2025 will be the year of the snake!





#### Speak Out, Stay Safe

We are signed up to work with the NSPCC and all the families with children in Key Stage One have been sent an email including vital information. If your child is already 7 years old, there is a survey that they can take part in at school. There is a consent form for parents and carers to sign if you would like your child to take part. 
We will not be collecting money, but raising awareness, you can donate on the NSPCC website if you would like to.

## Walter Infant School rated 'outstanding' by Ofsted

Walter Infant School and Nursery in Murray Road, Wokingham, was given the rating following the recent inspection. The school provides education for young children, including a nursery, and has a significant number of pupils and staff. Inspectors found that 'pupils find this school inspirational' and that 'pupils find learning irresistible.' They also noted that 'reading is taught excellently' and that 'staff are proud to be part of this school.'

The report highlighted the support provided by the staff, stating that 'pupils are supported by expert staff.'

The inspectors also mentioned that 'pupils delight in remembering experiences.'

The school had not been inspected since 2013, and this was the first inspection for the current headteacher and deputy headteacher.

The school expressed their delight at the outcome of the inspection and invited people to visit the school to see the staff and pupils in action.

They also extended an invitation to meet Walter, the school dog, who received a personal mention in the Ofsted report. The school said: "We found our experience of Ofsted to be very positive since the adaptations made to the process and of course we are delighted with the outcomes, as we had not been inspected since 2013 and Stephanie and I had not been inspected as head or deputy before."

The full report can be found on the school's website. The school is now looking forward to continuing their work and maintaining their high standards.

#### We can help!

If you are struggling to provide anything essential for your child's well-being, such as pyjamas, coats, shoes, socks, underwear, school uniform, bedding etc please ask us as we are here to help. We do not want any of our children to miss out on the basic fundamentals that they are all entitled to. As before, please just ask.

#### Pupil Premium Funding

Some of our families are entitled to Pupil Premium Funding for their children; this is a wonderful addition to our school's budget and helps us to provided curriculum enrichment and support for our Pupil Premium children and all other children too!

Your child may be entitled to this funding which can be used to pay for clubs, uniform, additional support, one to one nurture, Canine Assisted learning etc.

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits you may be eligible for free school meals or the pupil premium:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- 3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and

Working Tax Credit is not in payment.

- 5) Guarantee Pension Credit.
- 6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- 7) Universal Credit.


