

Walter Infant School and Nursery Friday Flyer

Dear Walter Families,

Sadly, before I am able to celebrate what an amazing time we have had in school this week, I have to inform you of a most unfortunate event that occurred today which some of your children may mention! I noticed from my office window, during a meeting, some children climbing the fence and talking to an unknown adult in a parked car. I immediately left my meeting as I saw the stranger was also taking photographs. Mrs Bell quickly followed!

I asked the stranger who she was and she said she was an 'aunt' of one of the children. I asked her to immediately delete the photographs and to move on. She said she had deleted the photographs but refused to move on, so we had to evacuate the whole playground for at least 10 minutes, until with the support of my staff and a parent she decided to leave the vicinity. We have of course, reported the incident to the police.

My most important job in school is to keep your precious children safe, above and beyond anything else I do. It is not acceptable for anyone to take photographs of the children, whoever they may be, or however they know one or more children. Photographs of children can be used in many ways on the internet and some of our children need additional protection, and their parents or carers may have declined parental acceptance for photographs. This was indeed, one of the most shocking events of my 40 years of working in education, as I was unable to understand the stranger's reluctance to leave, and to watch as we coned off the pitch and removed 180 children to a safe space away from her camera. The police took the incident very seriously and will proceed with due diligence. We were able to take note of the number plate.

May I please take this opportunity to remind you all that you must never use your mobile phones on or around the school site. I have to remind adults almost every day not to use their phones when coming into the school playground. Please keep your phones in your pockets and bags for the whole time you are on the school


premises, unless watching a performance in the school hall or playground. If you have any concerns or questions, please do not hesitate to contact me. head@walter.wokingham.sch.uk




Have a brilliant time reading and sharing books. I hear lots of you are budding authors and illustrators! Maybe you will be inspired to start work on some fresh new stories of your own?




School Councillors choosing books for everyone!





A jelly and Ice-cream Party! I have to say, I did not get any fruit or ice-cream and thankfully no jelly, as I don't like jelly!








Amazing Work in School

Household Support Fund can help you

There's more than £500,000 available to help Wokingham Borough residents through the Household Support Fund this winter. You can apply if you're struggling to pay for:

- Food
- Bills
- Energy costs
- Other everyday essentials

The Household Support Fund has been allocated by the Department for Work and Pensions to councils in England to pass on money to residents who need it. What you're entitled to depends on your situation:

- Free school meal families £15 per week, per child during the school holidays for each child receiving means-tested free school meals
- Pensioners, carers and disabled people one off grant of £120
- All other households one off grant of £60

The current round covers October 1, 2024 to March 31, 2025. Do not re-apply if you've already got a payment recently.

If you successfully applied for a Household Support Grant between 1 April and 30 September 2024, you will automatically get another payment this winter. It will be paid six months after your last payment. You do not need to re-apply. Apply now: https://www.wokingham.gov.uk/cost-living/household-support-fund








And I have to share with you the amazing displays of the Year 2 work in school:

If you are struggling to provide anything essential for your child's well-being, such as pyjamas, coats, shoes, socks, underwear, school uniform, bedding etc please ask us as we are here to help. We do not want any of our children to miss out on the basic fundamentals that they are all entitled to. As before, please just ask.

Pupil Premium Funding

Some of our families are entitled to Pupil Premium Funding for their children; this is a wonderful addition to our school's budget and helps us to provided curriculum enrichment and support for our Pupil Premium children and all other children too!

Your child may be entitled to this funding which can be used to pay for clubs, uniform, additional support, one to one nurture, Canine Assisted learning etc.

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits you may be eligible for free school meals or the pupil premium:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.

- 3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.
- 5) Guarantee Pension Credit.
- 6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- 7) Universal Credit.
