

### Autism understanding & acceptance (at Woodley Airfield Centre)

Friday 28th February 2025

9.30am start, workshop concludes at 12 noon (Registration opens 9.15am)

Build your understanding of autism – the 'hidden' disability including language, social interaction, sensory issues, anxieties and discuss some strategies and tools that might help and support autistic individuals to make sense of the world around them.

#### Supporting Siblings (at Woodley Airfield Centre)

An opportunity to explore the impact on siblings of having an autistic brother or sister. We discuss the difficulties that this can bring as well as the benefits. Included within the workshop are lots of practical strategies and ideas that may be helpful in supporting siblings to understand autism, cope with their experiences and feel valued for who they are.

### Creating and using visual supports including social scripts, drawing whilst talking (at Woodley Airfield Centre)

Tuesday 29th April 2025

An intervention using a variety of visuals which can help support development and improved understanding of social events and expectations in a given situation. You will have the opportunity to create and practice using visual supports in your environment.

## Supporting autistic individuals to understand and self-manage emotions & feelings (including anger)

Tuesday 6th May 2025

7pm prompt start, workshop concludes at 9pm (MS Teams presentation)

Build a deeper understanding of autism and consider how autistic people can be supported to understand their own and others' emotions (feelings) including anger and so support the development of self-management strategies.

I just wanted to let you know that the workshop was so helpful - I have already used it to help my son. It was really well presented and opened my eyes further to how different minds work.

### Please note when booking your workshop:

'What is autism' is covered in depth in the autism understanding & acceptance workshop only.

**For all other workshops -** it is important that you have a basic understanding and knowledge of autism either through your own experience or because you have already attended an autism understanding workshop, as 'what is autism' is not covered in depth.

### **New Recycling Bank at Walter**

We will be getting our own recycling bank next week, this has been organised by the PTA and is great way to recycle as well as fundraise for our school. It is a free service and we will receive 20p per kilo. Please use it as often as you can: they are


able to collect all types of clothing, including branded uniform, accessories such as hats, scarves, gloves, handbags and belts, as well as bed linen, towels and soft toys. We are using a company called: Astra Recycling

This is a great way to fundraise as well as promote the importance of recycling. The textiles collected are either sent to Eastern Europe to be used again or converted into insulation materials and industrial cleaning wipes, so less than 1% of what we collect ends up in the ground. It arrives on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2025.









**NSPCC Speak Out, Stay Safe** 



On Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> February, we will have workshops delivered by volunteers from the NSPCC to support our children in Year 2 to Speak Out, and Stay Safe. These will take place in the morning and will follow on from the work that has been happening in school over the last couple of weeks. Thank you for giving your consent for your 7 year old child to take part in the questionnaire; after reading the questionnaire, the Year 2 Team and the Senior Management Team think that the best way for the children to complete the questionnaire, is at home with family, as it is very much a one to one questionnaire and would take too long for 90 children to complete in school as they need to much support to read and understand the questions. Speak out Stay safe Programme Pupil survey - 2024/25

We hope you enjoyed Speak out Stay safe. We want to make sure that children enjoy our programme and learn something new. Below are some questions so you can share your thoughts. It will take five minutes to complete. We will not be able to know who said what, just the year group and school you are in.

If you are struggling to provide all you need to at the moment; we can provide Food Vouchers for the Foodbank and fuel vouchers.

### We can help!

If you are struggling to provide anything essential for your child's well-being, such as pyjamas, coats, shoes, socks, underwear, school uniform, bedding etc please ask us as we are here to help. We do not want any of our children to miss out on the basic fundamentals that they are all entitled to. As before, please just ask.

### **Pupil Premium Funding**

Some of our families are entitled to Pupil Premium Funding for their children; this is a wonderful addition to our school's budget and helps us to provided curriculum enrichment and support for our Pupil Premium children and all other children too!

Your child may be entitled to this funding which can be used to pay for clubs, uniform, additional support, one to one nurture, Canine Assisted learning etc.

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits you may be eligible for free school meals or the pupil premium:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- 3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.
- 5) Guarantee Pension Credit.
- 6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- 7) Universal Credit.
