Gymnastics






1. My child is happy at this school.






2. My child feels safe at this school.


3. The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.


4. My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the matter quickly.





5. The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.

7. Does your child have special educational needs and/or disabilities?






8. My child has special educational needs and/or disabilities and the school gives them the support they need to succeed.


9. The school has high expectations for my child.


10. My child does well at this school.


11. The school lets me know how my child is doing.


12. There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.







15. The school offers a good range of clubs and activities for my child.


16. I feel children have been supported and protected as much as possible during the COVIE pandemic.

These charts allow us to see where we are doing well and what we need to do to improve; we are always striving to be better so your opinions really count.

Some of the comments made were delightful and we were so pleased to read about all the things you like about the school.

Some of the things that are not so good we have already started to change: for example, we have amended the school lunch menu so that it is much more child-friendly and certainly less spicy. Hopefully this will mean the children enjoy their lunches more. We always discourage the children from choosing a jacket potato everyday (we don't even have jacket potatoes on Wednesday)!

Some parents wish we had more homework; the children are expected to read every night, as they progress through school the expectations for homework increase, for example spelling tests. Our children are very young and we want them to have lots of fun, rest and relaxation when they are away from school, as well as fresh air, exercise and lots of opportunities to cycle, run, climb, play, swim and so much more.

Some parents think the homework is just right, some would like it to be less!

Some parents think there are too many emails, some think we should communicate more and some wish we sent fewer messages.

- "Reduce the amount of correspondence as it can be overwhelming at times"
- "Good communication with parents"
- "General communication is great and helps organise the children / parents activities"
- "Appreciate text messages for urgent news alerts"
- "More frequent communication"

I agree that some weeks we send out a large number of emails; I try to condense day to day information in the Friday Flyer, but sometimes we feel we need to send reminders so that children do not feel left out or disadvantaged, e.g. own clothes days. At this time of year (Summer Fair) there are lots of emails, but we do rely on your support to raise money for the school. We will try to get the balance right for everyone.

Next week I will share some of your more specific comments and what we might be able to do to improve things for our children and their families.

One parent sadly commented as something to improve:

"Talking to parents in a respectful tone, especially the head teacher"

I would like to apologise to this parent personally, as the survey was anonymous, this is my only opportunity. I cannot recall an event where I may have been disrespectful, but I am truly sorry. I like to think that, as respect is one of our Five Values, I demonstrate it all the time. I will try harder.
