Dear Walter Families,

This week I have had to speak with so many children about hurting each other, we have sadly seen hitting, kicking, scratching, pinching and even biting. We are a Therapeutic School, if a child cannot play kindly with the other children, they have to play by themselves when the other children are inside. Usually, one playtime without anyone to play with is enough to enable children to realise that they want to play at the same time as the other children. However, we have children who are Autistic, have a diagnosis for ADHD, some are non-verbal and some children have high emotional needs. We have been training all our staff to support our children when they are dysregulated, but it can take time to help the children change behaviours they have been displaying for some time. Every time a child is hurt on purpose, by another child, both families are informed; the child who is the 'perpetrator' is sanctioned to hopefully remind them that it is better not to hurt others. Please can you help us by reinforcing the following two messages at home:

PLEASE USE YOUR HANDS KINDLY!





IF SOMEONE IS UNKIND TO YOU TELL AN ADULT!



When to Tell an Adult

- It can sometimes be tricky to know when to ask a grown-up for help.
- Sometimes, we face problems that we can solve on our own.
- Other times, we need to ask a trusted adult for help.

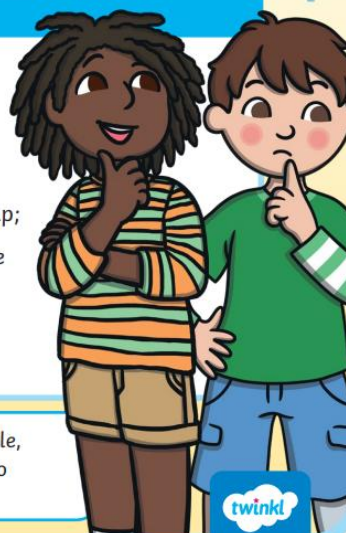
Speak to a trusted adult when:

- something is making you feel uncomfortable;
- you feel you need help;
- someone is doing something that could hurt themselves and others;
- someone is being unkind;
- something is stopping you from learning;
- you feel someone else may need help.

If none of these apply, it may be something that you could try to sort out yourself.

Could you:

- calmly talk about the problem;
- move away;
- ask a friend for help;
- find something else to do;
- solve the problem safely and fairly?



Remember, trusted adults are always here to help.

If something is making you feel uncomfortable, reach out and speak to an adult you trust who can help you to solve the problem.

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How Big is My Problem?

5

Emergency

You need help from an adult e.g. fire, someone needs to go to the hospital, danger etc.



4

Gigantic problem

You can change this with a lot of help e.g. someone hurting you, hitting, bullying etc.



3

Medium problem

You can change with some help e.g. having to work with someone you don't like, someone takes something of yours, you have to do something you don't want to do etc.



2

Little problem

You can change with a little reminder e.g. not being first in line, not taking turns, not winning a game etc.



1

Glitch

You can fix this yourself e.g. getting changed for PE, forgetting a favourite toy, cleaning up etc.

Important Safeguarding Notice: Children's "Spy" Books

We want to make you aware of a recent issue affecting some popular children's books by Andrew Cope, including the *Spy Dogs*, *Spy Cats*, and *Spy Pups* series. Some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been taken over by another party and now leads to inappropriate adult content.

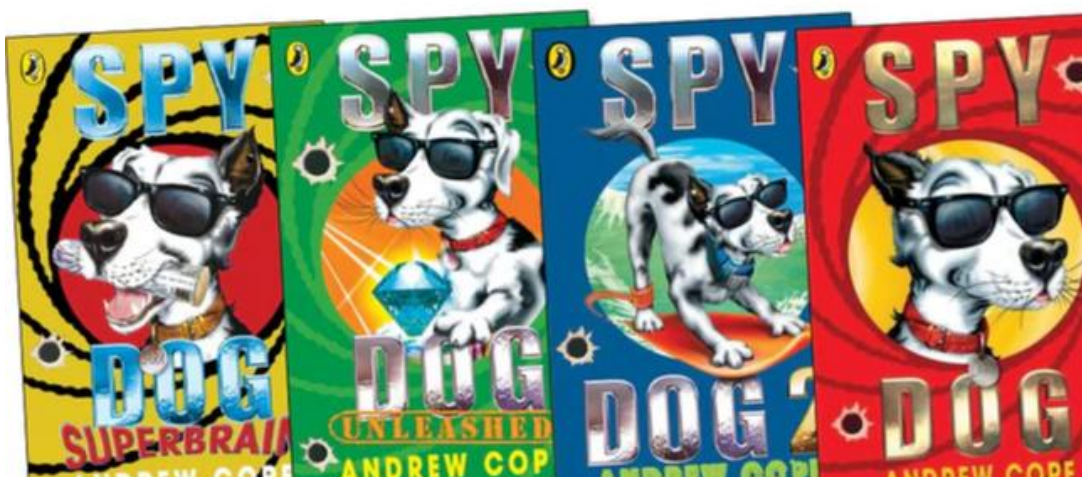
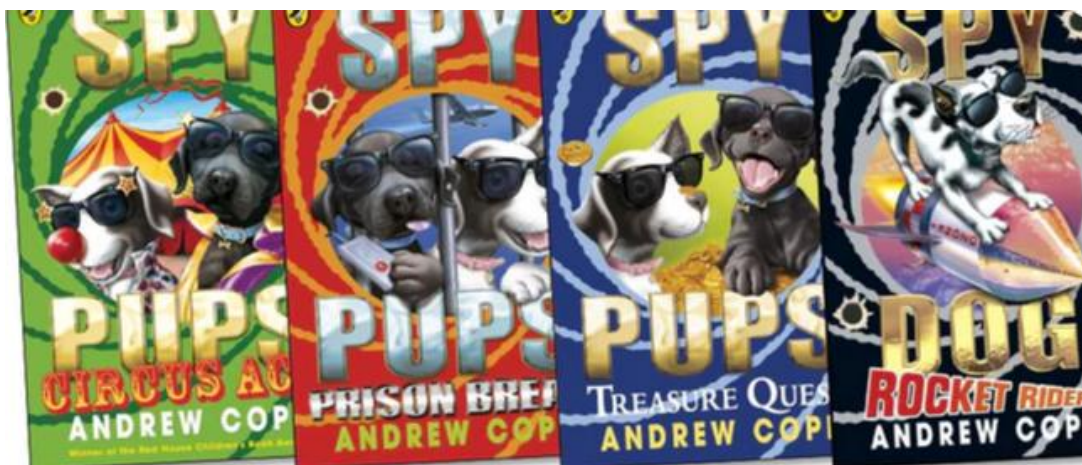
The publisher, Puffin, has paused sales and distribution of the books and is working with schools, libraries, and retailers to remove copies from circulation. They have stressed that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.

What this means for you:

If your child has any *Spy Dog*, *Spy Cat* or *Spy Pups* books at home, please check the back for website links and make sure they do not try to visit the site.

It is safe for children to continue reading the stories themselves — the concern is only with the outdated link.

We recommend talking with your child about the importance of not following web addresses in books without checking with an adult first.
