


Walter Infant School and Nursery EQUALITY STATEMENT

- We have over 40 different languages spoken in our school and 13 of the possible 17 ethnic groups are represented by our pupils
- We learn about and celebrate the festivals that our families celebrate
- Our curriculum, including the books we choose to learn from, enable our children to see versions of themselves represented


Mutual Respect


- One of our core values is respect; our children understand what is to respect others and to feel respected

- We demonstrate good manners and good behaviours


Individual Liberty


- Our children are free to be themselves

Our Duty at Walter Infant School and Nursery
