Dear Walter Families,

This morning I led an assembly linking to our topic of 'Healthy Me!' which is part of our Personal, Social, Relationships and Health Education Curriculum. We shared a story which focused on eating the correct food, making good choices and telling the truth. The story was based on how the Honesty Hedgehog came to have his name.



It has come to my attention that some children are not eating their lunches in school, sometimes it is because they are hurrying to get out to play, but more often they are saying they don't like what they have chosen. The caterers at our school provide wonderful food, which is cooked and prepared freshly each morning, many of the staff choose the school dinners as they actually do taste nice! We have adjusted the menu to be more child friendly and we have a number of choices each day.

I asked the children to put their hands up if they choose a jacket potato every day; there were quite a lot of hands. I asked them to keep their hands up if they didn't like jacket potatoes and at least 12 hands remained in the air. It seems they like the beans and cheese, or even the tuna and salad, but not the potatoes!

Please could you ask your children what sort of things they find difficult to eat at school and let their teachers know, we can then ensure that we help them to choose something they like eating. We have a long day at school and we talked about how we feel when we are hungry; we agreed that it didn't feel good at all and we certainly did not have any energy.

I then asked the children to put their hands up if they had come to school without eating any breakfast; the class teachers looked to see which of their children put up their hands. We spoke about the importance of having some healthy food to eat before coming to school. The class teachers have spoken to the children individually and some parents have been contacted.

Please ensure your children have a healthy breakfast: here are some recommendations!!!!



Alternatively, a glass of milk and a bowl of cereal is more than satisfactory and will keep your children going until snack time! Try to make it sugar free.



We have cereal and milk in our pantry if you are struggling to provide everything each day.

Pupil Premium Funding

Some of our families are entitled to Pupil Premium Funding for their children; this is a wonderful addition to our school's budget and helps us to provided curriculum enrichment and support for our Pupil Premium children and all other children too!

Your child may be entitled to this funding which can be used to pay for clubs, uniform, additional support, one to one nurture, Canine Assisted learning etc.

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits you may be eligible for free school meals or the pupil premium:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- 3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.
- 5) Guarantee Pension Credit.
- 6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- 7) Universal Credit.
