

Autism Acceptance Week

This week is Autism Acceptance Week; we have a number of children who have a diagnosis of autism, are waiting to be diagnosed or are on the autism pathway. It can take a long time for a diagnosis to be made, mainly because there is a more than 2 year waiting list. It is commonly recognised that young girls can mask their symptoms, that means they might behave differently at school from how they behave at home or in other places. Bethan used to come to our school; her mummy has shared this inspirational information with me today:

Tonight, during the ad break of Googlebox, Channel 4 will air the winner of its Disability in Advertising prize. It's a short film by Vanish and Ambitious about Autism which spotlights the importance of clothing as an emotional lifeline for young autistic people and the gender gap for diagnoses.

The reason for flagging is that Bethan has been instrumental in getting this piece of work into the world. Her experience of clothing anxiety and hypersensitivity was used

in the advertising agency's original pitch to Channel 4, and then her famous mermaid nightie (which she wore to school when all other clothing felt "wrong") is featured at a free exhibition at gallery@oxo on London's Southbank. Her nightie is accompanied by her story, in her own words, so visitors can understand the importance of this garment and how it helps her feel safe and calm when she's struggling to navigate the world.

Free Holiday Camp for Children entitled to Free School Meals (as well as Pupil Premium Funding)

On Friday the 5th May we will be hosting our first ever Quiz Night: with the Coronation of King Charles in mind. Lots more information will follow but please get a babysitter and be ready for a Bring Your own Bottle night of fun! Teams will be 6 members, with a fee of £5 per player. There will be an opportunity to purchase sweet or savoury adult treat boxes to share on the table; more information will follow soon. I am sure some of the staff will be keen to take part too! This event is not for children of any age.

We can help!

If you are struggling to provide anything essential for your child's well-being, such as pyjamas, coats, shoes, socks, underwear, school uniform, bedding etc please ask us as we are here to help. We do not want any of our children to miss out on the basic fundamentals that they are all entitled to. As before, please just ask. Don't forget about Walter's Pantry.

Apply for the Household Support Fund if your child gets free school meals

If your child gets means-tested free school meals you are entitled to financial support this winter.

Wokingham Borough Council and First Days Children's Charity are working together to provide payments to help during school holidays. **We know this could be even more important as people struggle after the festive period.**

Apply through First Days Children's Charity.

Note you do not need to apply again if you have already had a successful application since October this year.

You can get £15 per week, per eligible child, during school holidays. This applies for half terms, Christmas and Easter holidays. It will be back paid to October half-term if you've not already applied.

The amount you get in total depends on the number of children in your family who receive free school meals:

- One child £120
- Two children £210
- Three children £315
- Four children £420
- Five children £525
- Six children £630

Pupil Premium Funding

Some of our families are entitled to Pupil Premium Funding for their children; this is a wonderful addition to our school's budget and helps us to provided curriculum enrichment and support for our Pupil Premium children and all other children too!

Your child may be entitled to this funding which can be used to pay for clubs, uniform, additional support, one to one sessions, Canine Assisted learning etc.

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits you may be eligible for free school meals or the pupil premium:

1) Income Support.

2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.

3) Income related Employment and Support Allowance.

4) Child Tax Credit - Where the family's annual income is not more than £16,190 and Working Tax Credit is not in payment.

5) Guarantee Pension Credit.

6) Support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.

7) Universal Credit.
