



Dear Walter Families,

Everyone here is so excited for our full re-opening on Monday; we are all working hard to make the school environment as welcoming and exciting for our children on their return as possible. We have lots of new resources, including brand new storage and tray units in all Key Stage 1 classes, all labelled up and ready for the new owners! Our staff members have attended training to support our children (and parents) with coming back to school and separating from their parents.

I hope you have been able to watch the assembly today: Try Not to Worry (on our website). It may provide an opportunity for you to chat with your children about how they feel about coming back to school; are they worried or excited, happy or sad (I imagine they will have a huge mixture of emotions). I am attaching some resources to this flyer that might be useful to use at home and to return to school on Monday. There is a feelings thermometer; you could draw a circle around each emotion your child is experiencing and draw an arrow to the temperature scale; a small worry or a great big worry. You can also discuss with your children how to manage their worries, after listening to Rosie's story and getting rid of some of those 'worry monsters'. Please remember that lots of things children are worried about are 'adult worries' so please try to reassure your child that you will manage those worries for them.

We are creating 'Calm Boxes' for every classrooms so that our children can 'take a break, re-balance, relax, breathe! We are developing calm corners and any anxious children will have access to our Nurture Assistants, who have all been hard at work getting ready. We have many new books and toys to support concerns and worries and lots of strategies

ready to put into place as and when they are needed. Please ensure that you notify us of any significant changes (happy or sad) so that we can support your child in school.



## **Lateral Flow Tests**

All families with school age children can apply for lateral flow tests, these are the tests that all of our staff are completing twice a week. ## Start and finish times and PE days

Parents with children who will be attending our F1 Robin Class will have sole access and egress through the Oxford Road gate; this is because we have parents dropping off and collecting their children throughout the day and we have children attending in the morning or afternoon: the gate will be in use at 8:30 am, 11:30 am, 12:30 pm, 2:30 pm and 3:30 pm. Please enter our site and socially distance until your child is welcomed into school. Parents with children who will be attending our Year 2 Pine, Sycamore and Willow Classes will use the main school vehicle gates on Murray Road at 8:30 am and 3:00 pm. Parents with children who will be attending our Year 1 Beech, Larch and Oak Classes will use the main school vehicle gates at 8:35am and 3:05 pm.

Parents with children who will be attending our FS2 Dove, Magpie and Woodpecker Classes will use the main school vehicle gates on Murray Road at 8:40 am and 3:10 pm. Your child will need to come in school uniform as described in your information booklet; they will need a <u>coat (suitable for rainy weather)</u> and sensible shoes. Please label every item of clothing including shoes. Please can all children come to school on their PE days wearing trainers and their PE kits; Foundation Stage children will need to wear trainers and joggers or leggings.
