
We have been researching deeply into the best ways to support our children and something that has resonated with me and has been shared with staff is this:

"The learning need is often prioritised over an emotional or mental health need"


This week we have focussed on the well-being and mental health of our children and we will continue to ensure our children feel safe, secure and self-confident away from home.

Parent Survey


Thank you to all of you who kindly completed the school survey; I would like to share some of the results and comments with you.

1. My child is happy at this school.




2. My child feels safe at this school.



In Lockdown 1 (March 2020) we were not expected to provide lessons for home learning; developing a teaching and learning platform for children to use every day was new to us and most schools. We are significantly different from most schools as we are a large infant and nursery school. We provided lots of activities and links to many other sites including the Oak Academy, which was the government's recommendation for daily learning, we facilitated considerably more than most other schools.

In Lockdown 2, the school remained open for all children and we were very well supported by our families during this very strange and uncertain period.

In Lockdown 3, from the start of January, the government expected us to provide **3 hours** of learning a day. We were free to choose the methodologies and we chose to record our lessons as we wanted to enable our families to access them when it was most agreeable for them. We are an extremely experienced team of educators specialising in infant and Early Years Education; we used our knowledge and followed guidance on cognitive development and good pedagogies for young learners. We did not feel that live lessons were suitable for our children and some parents did not have access to devices or the internet (we were able to alleviate this problem). I still believe that our provision was exemplary and I am so proud of my teaching staff and all the children.

I understand that some parents wanted more than 3 hours of learning but children need time to do other things too; such as crafts, technology and physical activity. We provided many links to inside and outside activities and no-screen activities and shared further ideas via the newsletters. I am hopeful that we will not find ourselves in the same situation again!

I will be addressing other issues raised in future correspondence. Thank you.
