

# Friday Flyer 2022

Dear Walter Families,

As many of you already know, I have not been in school since Monday as I have been infected by the Coronavirus (Covid 19). I have been very well taken care of by these three wonderful and loving nurses, Walter, Fenway, and Blossom.



However, I have been extremely unwell, and I am still testing positive (with a very thick line)! I have been surprised by how poorly I have been; I have not had any of the recognised symptoms. It is very important to me to ensure that we continue to restrict the opportunity for the virus to spread to other people in our school, as it is still very dangerous to vulnerable people (luckily, I am not classed as a vulnerable person). Also, we have really struggled to keep going with the large number of staff absences. So, I would like to politely request that all parents coming into our school building, for consultations with the teachers, wear masks if you are able to. Thank you.

#### **Covid 19 Update**

The expectations for anyone with Covid 19 have now changed. There are no longer free LFD and PCR tests for most people so there is no expectation for anyone to test. However, Covid 19 has not gone away, and we still want to do all we can to keep our children healthy and free from all childhood diseases and illnesses. If your child is unwell, please keep them at home until they are better. If they have one of the original symptoms of Covid 19: a headache, loss of taste or smell, or a new persistent cough, please keep them at home for at least 3 days and do not send them to school if they still have a temperature. We will need to send children home if they present with any of these symptoms in school. I have been informed by Wokingham Borough Council that there is a rise in Chicken Pox cases, Hand, Foot, and Mouth and even a case of Measles.

This is the information posted by the NHS today: (it does refer to testing, which is now a choice not a directive).

If you have COVID-19, you can pass on the virus to other people for up to 10 days from when your infection starts. Many people will no longer be infectious to others after 5 days.

You should:

- try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days
- avoiding meeting <u>people at higher risk from COVID-19</u> for 10 days, especially if their immune system means they're at higher risk of serious illness from COVID-19, even if they've had a COVID-19 vaccine

This starts from the day after you did the test.

If a child or young person aged 18 or under tests positive for COVID-19, they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days. This starts from the day after they did the test.

Children and young people tend to be infectious to others for less time than adults. If they're well and do not have a temperature after 3 days, there's a much lower risk that they'll pass on COVID-19 to others.

#### Long Covid in Children

Although most children are not seriously ill with Covid 19, some are: I saw this little girl, Emily, who is 9 years old on morning television today (as I am at home). She contracted Covid 19 from an asymptomatic carrier in September 2021. She began presenting with the usual symptoms, but then very quickly the virus took away her mobility and she is still unable to walk unaided! She has already raised £7500 by walking with her aids around her garden. She is not going to stop until she can walk around her whole garden without any support. Good Luck Emily: you are an inspiration to other young children.



#### Fuel Vouchers for Families with pre-pay metres

We are all very aware that today the cap on fuel costs have been removed; this will have a very negative financial impact on all of us. If you pre-pay for your gas and electricity, we may be able to help with fuel vouchers. Sadly, the vouchers are only for pre-pay metres and are not valid for direct debit or final bill payers. If you need to a voucher, please contact Mrs Janes in the school office in complete confidence.

In Walter's Pantry we have food in school for breakfasts and cooked dinners; if you need anything please let us know. If you need help with Foodbank Vouchers, we are able to organise them for you through the school office. The foodbank also provide nappies, shampoo, washing powder and sanitary products. They will deliver to your door, so you do not need to be able to drive. Food vouchers are available for all families who need them, including working families. You do not need to be in receipt of benefits.

If you need school uniform, we will be able to provide good quality pre-used uniform free of charge (with support from our wonderful PTA).

If your child is in receipt of Pupil Premium Funding, you should have been registered for supermarket vouchers for the Easter Holiday period. If you have not heard, please speak to Mrs Janes.

#### **Celebrating Success and Achievement (outside school)**

These three pupils have shown us how they have been able to 'be the best they can be'. Samuel has received our first ever Certificate for Bravery after helping his daddy after he had a cycling accident away from home. Samuel showed extreme bravery and we are all incredibly proud of him.



Jenson has been volunteering for a local charity: his mum shared this wonderful photo and information with me. We are so proud of you Jenson.

"Jenson's nan and brother both volunteer for a charity that help with abandoned and neglected horses/ponies. The horse Jenson Is riding Is a horse called Ember who was abandoned at 3 months old. Jenson loves to help care for them and ride them to help these horses get used to having weight on them to help them find new homes. "




Aston has been working really hard to develop his martial art skills, which he never uses in school. His mum shared:




#### Ramadan

Some of our families will begin Ramadan this weekend. Ramadan this year is expected to begin on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> April, and to end on the 1<sup>st</sup> May 2022.



A typical day for a fasting Muslim would be: a pre-dawn "SuhUr" meal; dawn "Fajr" prayers; midday "Dhuhr" prayers; mid-afternoon "Asr" prayers; breaking the fast at sunset with an "Iftar" meal; sunset "Maghrib" prayers; night-time "Isha" prayers; extra night-time "Taraweeh" prayers. The impact of this routine on a student will be further discussed below.

#### **Pupil Premium Funding**

If you have experienced changes in your working hours or income and benefits, your child may now be entitled Pupil Premium Funding. Pupil Premium Funding is a wonderful addition to our school's budget and helps us to provided curriculum enrichment and support for our Pupil Premium children and all other children too! Please visit this link to see if your child may be entitled to the grant.

Your child may be entitled to this funding which can be used to pay for clubs, uniform, additional support, one to one sessions, Canine Assisted learning etc.

If you are in receipt of one the following benefits you may be eligible for free school meals or the pupil premium:

- 1) Income Support.
- 2) Income based Job Seeker's Allowance.
- 3) Income-based Employment and Support Allowance.
- 4) Child Tax Credit
- 5) Pension Credit.
- Working tax credit
- 6) Support as a result of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- 7) Universal Credit (if a household is earning less than £7,400 per year)

As stated previously, any child that is currently receiving free school meals is eligible for pupil premium funding. It's incredibly important that parents make the school aware that their child is eligible for this as it will automatically allow the school to receive extra funding that will go towards the betterment of their child's education.
