

Dear Walter Families,

We have become aware that some children, particularly in Foundation Stage 2 are arriving very late for school, sometimes after 9:00 am. So... not long now until we celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee next Friday on the 27<sup>th</sup> May 2022 (which is also the last day of this half term which has flown by) ~ we will celebrate in the garden and finish school at the usual times of 3:15, 3:20 and 3:30 pm.

#### **Online Safety**

All our children are very young and yet they tell us about the films, television programmes and videos they watch which are certainly not suitable to their age or stage of development. None of our children should be watching any film above a U certificate unaccompanied as there may well be content that could scare or confuse them, causing worries, anxieties and even nightmares. This is also the same for computer games, Youtube and Tiktok; the algorithms are set to introduce more and more content and even with parental controls in place. This week alone I have been told that a 4-year-old has watched Jurassic Park (which is terrifying) and that children in Year 2 have been playing Minecraft, Fortnite and Among Us (all for much older children and all include death and violence, including ghosts and zombies). There are so many wonderful games and programmes that are age appropriate and will not cause nightmares or worries; please make sure your children are not hearing or seeing things they cannot possibly understand fully. Let them grow up slowly, in their own time, having fun and playing age appropriate games.
